BAYFIELD COUNTY HOUSING READINESS

Communities across Bayfield County are struggling to meet their housing needs. This is especially challenging in areas where resources are more limited, and projects might lack the scale that developers prefer. A housing shortage has negative effects on economic development and overall quality of life. Here are some steps your community can take to help meet this critical need in Bayfield County:

GET ORGANIZED.

Months 1 - 2

- Town Board forms a Housing Steering Committee, which will meet to discuss:
 - The housing needs of the community: Are there specific populations in need (seniors, veterans, etc.)? What types of housing? How many units?
 - o Ideal locations Consider zoning/future land use plans, proximity to existing infrastructure, and current land ownership.

GET TOGETHER.

Months 2 - 3

- Committee shares a range of options with their Town Board and gets initial feedback.
 - o Which options are most feasible? Which ones can be eliminated or refined?
 - Town Board approves options to share for public input.

GATHER PUBLIC INPUT.

Month 4

- Committee prepares **visual representations** of housing development options and shares them with the broader community for feedback.
 - o Incorporate the feedback and **prioritize the options with the most support** and that will **best meet local needs**.
 - Build consensus around tangible action items.

MAKE A PLAN.

Months 5 - 6

The Committee will:

- Establish a timeline with short- and long-term goals for housing.
- Compile a list of what your community has to offer (available parcels, infrastructure, community support, etc.) in a development partnership.
- Identify and enlist key players and potential funding sources.
- Draft a Request for Proposals to share with developers.















New housing doesn't happen overnight. Communities that take the time to articulate their specific housing needs are more successful in attracting investors and developers that can help meet those needs.
